In 2011, we plan to participate for 10 weeks. We may start as early as June 9th and may continue until September 1st; we may find it necessary to skip one or two weeks during that period or may occasionally need to provide slightly more or less fruit value in a given week. A non-refundable sign-up fee of \$20 is required by March 31st. If a crop failure for peaches occurs due to weather conditions, then no further payment is required. Otherwise, complete payment is due by May 1st (see options below). Customers' fruit preferences will be honored to the extent possible. 1. SMALL ORDER (\$7/WEEK + \$20 SIGN-UP FEE = \$90)

Small order includes a small bag of peaches.

2. MEDIUM ORDER (\$10/WEEK + \$20 SIGN-UP FEE = \$120)

Medium order includes a medium bag of peaches, or a small bag of peaches plus one of the following – plums, muscadine grapes, or a watermelon.

3. LARGE ORDER (\$15/WEEK + \$20 SIGN-UP FEE = \$170)

Large order includes a large bag of peaches, or a medium bag of peaches plus one of the following – plums, muscadine grapes, or a watermelon.

PRODUCT DESCRIPTIONS

PEACHES	June – Early Sept.	We grow a number of different varieties; those that ripen in early June are clingstone, whereas varieties ripening later are freestone and tend to be of higher quality. Yellow-fleshed varieties include Clayton, Norman, Fireprince, Winblo, Contender, Redskin, Biscoe, and Big Red. White-fleshed varieties include Raritan Rose, Carolina Belle, and China Pearl
PLUMS	Late June – Late July	For 2011, we will have only the Santa Rosa variety.
WATERMELONS	July- August	For 2011, we will likely have only the Crimson Sweet variety, which is a seeded, medium-sized melon (volley ball to basketball size).
MUSCADINE GRAPES	Late Aug. – Early Sept.	Our primary varieties are Fry and Higgins (bronze-skinned Scuppernong type) and Nesbitt (black-skinned).
OTHER	Occasionally we will have other products, such as corn, tomatoes, and green beans, that can be purchased separately.

HISTORY

Clayton Orchard was established in the 1970s by Dr. Carlyle Clayton and his wife, Adelaide. Dr. Clayton was a nationally renowned plant pathologist at N.C. State University who specialized in fruit diseases. He helped develop a number of the peach varieties now grown in the southeastern U.S. Dr. Clayton passed away in 1998 and his wife, in 2007. Their son, Andy, who worked as a statistician at RTI for over 35 years, now operates the orchard, which is located in Montgomery County. See our website for additional information.
