The TN HISPC team has partnered with:

- The *Tennessee Office of e-Health Initiatives*, Tennessee's *e-Health Network*, the *University of Tennessee Health Science Center*, Tennessee's *Quality Improvement Organization (QIO)*, and an *Independent Practice Association (IPA)* to bring the HISPC message to as many TN providers as possible via the State's "***e-Prescribe Tennessee***" initiative...

Who is ePrescribe Tennessee?

- *ePrescribe Tennessee* is collaborative of Tennessee's leading prescribing stakeholders.

What is the Mission of ePrescribe Tennessee?

- *ePrescribe Tennessee* is striving to increase patient safety and meet the needs of the Tennessee public by establishing a collaborative framework that helps achieve an understanding of the benefits of electronic prescribing, while fostering education and implementation efforts to accelerate physician adoption and cooperation among prescribing constituents.

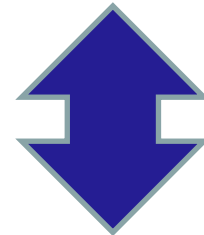

The HISPC/e-Prescribing Partnership...

- ***The HISPC Provider Education Toolkit (PET)*** initiative is charged with creating a toolkit to introduce electronic health information exchange (HIE) technology to providers, and educate them on the various aspects of *security* and *privacy* issues associated with electronic HIE ...



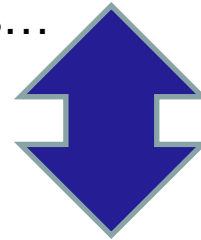
- ***The e-Prescribe Tennessee*** initiative facilitates provider access to an existing *private* and *secure* networking infrastructure, with *secure* file exchange and messaging, single sign-on identity management, and efficient e-Prescribing workflow and decision support processes...





The HISPC/e-Prescribing Partnership (cont)...

- **The *Provider Education Toolkit (PET)*** collaborative is charged with addressing the privacy and security *barriers* and challenges to interoperable HIE that may exist in the beliefs and attitudes held by many healthcare providers...



- The goal of the ***e-Prescribe Tennessee*** initiative is to remove *barriers* to e-Prescribing by engaging providers and pharmacists in discussions around HIE and demonstrating how e-Prescribing can benefit their patients and their practice/profession...





Tennessee's Approach to HISPC...

TN HISPC team has partnered with organizations that will leverage the HISPC initiative at the state and national levels:

- The *Tennessee Office of e-Health Initiatives*, *QSource (TN QIO)*, and the *Cumberland Pediatric IPA*; bringing the HISPC and e-Prescribing messages to as many TN providers as possible;
- The *Tennessee Medical Association (TMA)* and the *Tennessee Medical Group Management Association*; disseminating the HISPC e-mail blasts, news and press releases, and TN HISPC website information to providers across TN (www.secure4healthtn.com);
- The *national HISPC team*; offering free Category 1 CME's via the national HISPC website (www.secure4health.org);



Engaging the Provider...

National and State initiatives that feature tools and incentives have provided the framework for provider engagement in health information exchange:

HISPC

- State website, e-mail blasts, press releases, and partnerships with professional organizations, to “drive” providers toward the adoption and use of electronic health information exchange technology;

e-Prescribe Tennessee

- Grants to TN providers who are licensed to prescribe, to give them a “push” toward the EHR;
- Grants to TN independent pharmacies to *follow the lead* of retail pharmacies and become partners in e-Prescribing;



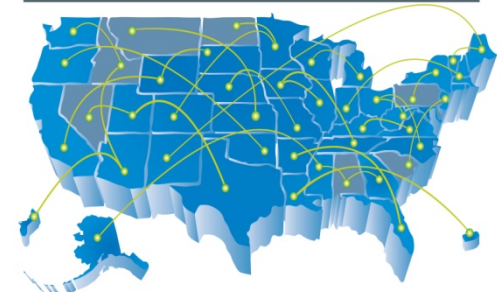
