SATEI Program Evaluations and Epidemiology Research

In addition to community-based studies, SATEI researchers also help design and implement studies focusing on the epidemiology and prevention of substance use and other high-risk behaviors through projects such as the National Survey on Drug Use and Health (NSDUH), State Outcomes Measurement and Management Systems (SOMMS) and Evaluation of the Social Information Processing Assessment Tool.

Current Projects

Screening, Brief Intervention, Brief Treatment and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) Cross-site Evaluation, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (September 2005 to date)

The Center for Substance Abuse Treatment within SAMHSA established the SBIRT cooperative agreement program at seven sites across the United States. The cross-site infrastructure for the SBIRT initiative supports three interrelated evaluation efforts: a process evaluation, an impact or outcome evaluation, and an economic evaluation.

National Survey on Drug Use and Health (NSDUH) Short Reports -- National Analytic Center for NSDUH and Other Data (July 2005 to date)

SAMHSA contracted with RTI to create the National Survey on Drug Use and Health (NSDUH, formerly the National Household Survey on Drug Abuse), a computer-assisted survey that gathers information from respondents across the nation regarding their drug and alcohol abuse, mental health, treatment utilization, and other issues.
