Description of Activity/Service:

PROJECT SUMMARY

RTI International is an independent, non-profit research institute providing research, development, and technical services to government and commercial clients worldwide. The Food Security and Agriculture division within the International Development Group is implementing the USAID-funded Feed the Future Transforming Agriculture activity in Ethiopia.

The purpose of the Feed the Future Ethiopia Transforming Agriculture Activity is to increase access to healthy diets, particularly for women and children, by improving competitiveness, inclusiveness, and resilience of the Ethiopian food and agriculture system. Feed the Future Ethiopia Transforming Agriculture is a core component of a suite of food and agriculture activities funded by USAID. The activity operates in USAID's Zone of Influence (ZOI), which includes 132 woredas across 12 regions and 2 city administrations: Addis Ababa, Afar, Amhara, Benishangul Gumz, Dire Dawa, Gambela, Harari, Oromia, Sidama, South Ethiopia, Central Ethiopia, Somali, Southwest Ethiopia, and Tigray.

USAID classified the 132 woredas in 5 Zone of Influence (ZOI) cluster <https://www.usaid.gov/sites/default/files/2022-05/GFSS-Country-Plan-Ethiopia-FINAL-April-2019.pdf>

PURPOSE OF ASSIGNMENT

To effectively measure the project's impact and success, strong and evidence-based baselines are required for the project's key indicators. This household level baseline assessment is meant to constitute the basis to measure the project performance over time. The household baseline will serve as a point of comparison for annual performance indicator reporting throughout the Feed the Future Ethiopia Transforming Agriculture project cycle. Additionally, it will assist in the programming and further targeting of Feed the Future Ethiopia Transforming Agriculture interventions. The Household Baseline Study will quantitatively profile individual participant characteristics and establish the baseline values for Feed the Future Ethiopia Transforming Agriculture performance indicators including: access to key nutritious foods, household income, food expenditure, technology application, crop area coverage, value of agriculture-related financing, and sales value.

This is prepared to recruit service provider to conduct a baseline study using a population-based sampling methodology. The Feed the Future Ethiopia Transforming Agriculture Collaborating, Learning, and Adapting (CLA)/Monitoring, Evaluation, and Learning (MEL) team will develop a data collection questionnaire and sampling methodology. The selected service provider recruits, hires, trains and deploys field enumerators; and provides data collection and cleaning services.

DETAILED ACTIVITIES

The selected service provider will lead the coordination and management of baseline data collection which will be a quantitative population-based household study focused on the collection of required impact and outcome indicators for the Feed the Future Ethiopia Transforming Agriculture intervention areas. Feed the Future Ethiopia Transforming Agriculture project MEL team will provide training on the nature of data to be collected and use of data collection tools on the tablets/ smart phone. The selected service provider will be provided with a data collection tool designed in Tangerine where enumerators will collect the data using tablets or Android phones.

The following activities will be the responsibility of the successful applicant with the oversight, input, and guidance of the Feed the Future Ethiopia Transforming Agriculture MEL Manager:

Preparatory phase:

In collaboration with RTI, the selected service provider will:

- Revised the draft methodology designed by RTI and finalize general methodology, approach and sample size based on Feed the Future guidance (<https://www.fantaproject.org/sites/default/files/resources/FTF-PBS-Sampling%20Guide-Apr2018.pdf>).
- develop a training plan and training materials for enumerators.
- participate in the development of study design and methodology in consultation with the Feed the Future Ethiopia Transforming Agriculture MEL team.
- Ensure any necessary local clearances are obtained prior to beginning data collection.

RTI will:

- share relevant project documents and draft survey questionnaire.
- share list of ZOI woreda and Kebele
- Train the selected service provider on mobile data collection system (Tangerine)
- refine the survey instrument.
- program the survey instrument into a mobile data collection platform.

Field work: Field work will take place in targeted areas in the ZOI noted above. This survey must be conducted via in-person household level visits to FTFE ETA-potential participants including producers, processors, traders, government, and non-government officers. During the field work, and with the support of the project team, the selected service provider will:

- Recruit data collectors. The selected service provider will identify the total number of data collectors needed based on data collection caseload described in this ToR) who will be responsible for collecting the quantitative data for this study.
- Train data collectors and conduct field testing of the questionnaire.
- Coordinate with the Feed the Future Ethiopia Transforming Agriculture MEL team and partner staff to select and locate households as needed.
- Translate questionnaires from English to Amharic, and regional languages as necessary.
- Prepare enumerator training material.
- Coordinate logistical arrangements for the data collection, including transportation, lodging and per-diem for enumerators, and field supervision.
- Provide Samsung tablets for data collection.
- Supervise data collection, ensuring high data quality throughout data collection along with adherence to strong ethical considerations. Vendor is responsible for checking and monitor the data quality, including: consistency and timelines, completeness and traceability.
- Prepare update reports of progress and rapid identification of issues with proposed solutions.
- Sync collected data on a daily basis.
- Communicate with the MEL team during data cleaning.

Sample size:

The selected service provider will collaborate with the Feed the Future Transforming Agriculture Ethiopia MEL team to develop a cost-effective sample design which minimizes standard errors of estimates and, as much as possible, aligns with the [Participant-Based Survey Sampling Guide for Feed the Future Annual Monitoring Indicators](#).

The survey will be conducted in the ETA ZOI area based on a representative, random sample of the population living in the ZOI. The ZOI survey will use a cross-sectional, multi-stage cluster sampling design.

The total sample household is estimated at 2,450 individuals. *This estimate is subject to change based on the actual sampling calculation. The data collection must be conducted within one month period after the award.*

The Feed the Future Ethiopia Transforming Agriculture MEL Manager will guide the successful service provider to launch the baseline survey with sampled households from the targeted activities.

KEY QUALIFICATIONS

The vendor should have demonstrated ability to:

- Recruit and manage the baseline survey team through the period of performance.
- Have experience in quantitative data collection.
- Have experience in using digital devices for data collection.
- Have strong communication (written and spoken) skills in the ZOI woreda local language.
- Have willingness to work in rural areas.

Qualification for lead consultant:

- Must have a recognized university degree in agricultural economics/economics, statistics, development studies or related areas of discipline.
- A minimum of 5 years of relevant experience in data collection specially related to household surveys

Qualification for enumerators/data collectors:

- The service provider should propose the minimum qualifications for enumerators that are consistent with the proposed approach.

Due to internal procedures, our preference for this project would be to submit our proposals from our Europe parent company. If successful, our parent company will subcontract to Ethiopia Branch. Our Parent company is only able to process invoices in USD or EUR. Given this restriction, **is it possible to submit our budget, and should we be successful, receive payments in USD?**
