


- Terms of Service are legal agreements between a service provider and consumers
- Most online agreements are incomprehensible to Americans
- The increasing use of wearable devices for monitoring health status may put consumers at risk
- $_{\odot}\,$ Assess readability of fitness tracker privacy policies and terms of use/service
 - Fitbit, Garmin, Apple, Oura










Results





- Materials started out being hard to read and continued to be hard to read.
- Vendors that focus on specific products are much more transparent about their policies and contracts (Oura vs. others).
- Older, more established companies have longer contracts.
- This assessment is part of a broader effort to conduct a legal review of these materials. This work is still in progress.



- Vendors should increase readability and attractiveness of reading.
- Consumers should attempt to compare policies before purchasing devices.
- Researchers and Institutional Review Board should review and compare device policies before selecting them for studies.
 - The risks and benefits of policies should be summarized (in plain language) as a part of informed consent.
