

Together with Library and Information Services, RTI Press is part of the Scientific Stature Hub, which enriches, tracks, and disseminates RTI research to elevate the Institute’s scientific stature.

Accomplishments

- **RTI Press promotes science for the global good.** Our Open Access publications were viewed from 157 countries in FY21.
- **RTI Press publications reach diverse audiences.** We published the report *Senegal Farmer Networks Respond to COVID-19* in both English and French to improve access by readers in Senegal. The book *The Essential Role of Language in Survey Research* was named a 2021 must-read for market researchers by Qualtrics.
- **RTI Press leads on strategic topics.** We launched the series *Diversifying Energy Options in a Carbon-Constrained World* to provide accessible, science-based perspectives that inform policymakers and general audiences.
- RTI Press contributed to the Scientific Stature Hub’s accomplishments, including
 - **Adoption of ORCID iDs by 65% of RTI researchers** to facilitate tracking of research outputs
 - **Endorsement of Open Access publishing** by the Executive Leadership Team to support and guide researchers
 - **Establishment of a pilot subsidy fund** to offset costs of publishing in Open Access journals
