Gift* is a little girl in Kenya who has overcome daunting challenges in her young life. As an infant, she suffered from respiratory problems and developed tonsillitis. After her tonsils were removed incorrectly, Gift stopped speaking and communicated with gestures. Labeled as mentally challenged, she attended special needs classes. Her teachers described her as aggressive and unable to learn.


Not willing to give up, Gift's mother found Tusome, which means "Let's read" in Kiswahili. This U.S. Agency for International Development-funded early grade learning program is implemented by RTI International and is currently working in over 23,000 primary schools across Kenya. Among other things, Tusome supports Kenya's Ministry of Education in delivering teacher training and instructional support. Gift was placed in a participating first-grade class and her life changed. Gift's teacher, Ms. Valma, credits Tusome training with helping her to reach her students.

Gift's newfound ability to read and write has also dramatically altered her behavior. She has high self-esteem, is a cooperative member of her class, and she loves to play with other children.
