Issue



- These documents can become public records when submitted to state governments and thus become subject to disclosure.
- Each state handles public records and disclosure differently.

A one-stop guide to allow RTI staff to

- Quickly review how a given state deals with public records, particularly confidential information submitted to governments by private entities
- Tailor bids and proposals to most effectively safeguard RTI's sensitive information
